Powersoccer

Powersoccer is an exciting and competitive sport played by individuals with many different disabilities. The sport of Powersoccer was created in the early 1980's in Victoria, BC, and is currently played in Canada, the United States, Europe and Japan.



The Game

Powersoccer is played inside a gymnasium, with teams of four players to a side. Players manoeuvre an oversized soccer ball strategically, to score on the opposing teams.

Equipment

A power wheelchair is required to play Powersoccer. A foot guard made of a durable material must be individually fitted to the chair. Soccer balls, 13" in diameter, and foot guards can be purchased by calling the Surrey Team contacts (ask for Gord, 604-596-1044) who will also provide information on attaching the foot guards.

Commitment

Electric Wheelchair Hockey

Electric Wheelchair Hockey provides individuals with limited upper body strength and mobility the opportunity to experience the challenge and thrill of competition. In BC the sport was first played in Victoria. Two local teams then formed the Vancouver Island Division and joined the Canadian Electric Wheelchair Hockey Association in 1998. National tournaments are held every 2 years. A Vancouver team started in 2002 and regular exhibition games are held every year between Vancouver and Victoria.



The Game

Electric Wheelchair Hockey is played inside a gymnasium, with teams of five players to a side. Games are refereed using adapted NHL rules.

Equipment

Game sticks are plastic field hockey sticks that can be held or attached to the wheelchair. The puck is a lightweight plastic whiffle ball.
